

Join us at our 41st Annual Conference USQ, TOOWOOMBA, 6-8 DECEMBER 2017

ANZRSAI Award for Best Conference Paper by a Student

The Australia and New Zealand Regional Science Association (ANZRSAI) will host its 41st Annual Conference on the Toowoomba campus of USQ, 6-8 December 2017. The theme this year is "Fostering Regional Resilience, Engagement and Innovation".

At the conference, ANZRSAI will present an Award for the Best Conference Paper by a Student, sponsored by the Bureau of Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Economics. There is a small cash grant given to the winner (\$300) and up to two other candidates highly commended by the judges (\$100 each). To be eligible for this Award, the following conditions must be met:

- The lead author of the paper either: is currently enrolled as a full-time student; or has graduated from a Masters or PhD programme after 1 January 2016.
- An abstract for the paper is submitted on-line by 16 October 2017.
- A copy of the full paper is sent to Professor Paul Dalziel by email at <u>paul.dalziel@lincoln.ac.nz</u> by 3 November 2017.
- The paper is presented at the conference by the student.

The winner of the 2016 ANZRSAI Award for the Best Conference Paper by a Student was Amanda Qian Wu (University of Tasmania) for her co-authored paper "Going off the Beaten Track: Exploring Chinese International Students' Motivations for Selecting Regional Australian Higher Education."
