**ANZRS AI Award for  
Best Conference Paper  
by a Student**

The Australia and New Zealand Regional Science Association (ANZRS AI) will host its 43<sup>rd</sup> Annual Conference on the CQUniversity Cairns Campus, 4-6 December 2019. The theme this year is “Working Together to Grow: Innovations and Disruptions in Regional Development”.

At the conference, ANZRS AI will present an Award for the Best Conference Paper by a Student, sponsored by the Bureau of Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Economics. There is a small cash grant given to the winner (\$300) and up to two other candidates highly commended by the judges (\$100 each). To be eligible for this Award, the following conditions must be met:

- The lead author of the paper either: is currently enrolled as a full-time student; or has graduated from a Masters or PhD programme after 1 January 2018.
- An abstract for the paper is submitted on-line by 27 September 2019.
- A copy of the full paper is sent to Professor Paul Dalziel by email at [paul.dalziel@lincoln.ac.nz](mailto:paul.dalziel@lincoln.ac.nz) by 1 November 2019.
- The paper is presented at the conference by the student.

The winner of the 2018 ANZRS AI Award for the Best Conference Paper by a Student was Mst Sabrina Haque for her co-authored paper “Assessing the impacts of extreme weather events on selected fruit production in Central Queensland, Australia: A relational analysis using flood data.” This was published in the refereed conference proceedings, available at <https://www.anzrsai.org/assets/Conferences/ANZRS AI-2018-Conference-Proceedings.pdf>.
