**ANZRS AI Award for
Best Conference Paper
by a Student**

The Australia and New Zealand Regional Science Association (ANZRS AI) will host its 44th Annual Conference on the RMIT University City Campus in Melbourne, 6-7 December 2021. The theme this year is “**Risk! The Challenge of Managing Risks to Regional Futures**”.

At the conference, ANZRS AI will present an Award for the Best Conference Paper by a Student, sponsored by the Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Communications. There is a small cash grant given to the winner (\$300) and up to two other candidates highly commended by the judges (\$100 each). To be eligible for this Award, the following conditions must be met:

- The lead author of the paper: either, is currently enrolled as a full-time student; or, has graduated from a Masters or PhD programme after 1 January 2020.
- An abstract for the paper is submitted on-line by 27 September 2021.
- A copy of the full paper is sent to Professor Paul Dalziel by email at paul.dalziel@lincoln.ac.nz by 1 November 2021.
- The paper is presented at the conference by the student.

The ANZRS AI Award for Best Conference Paper by a Current or Recent Student 2019 was awarded to Md Zillur Rahman for his co-authored paper “Spatial and Temporal Contexts of Changes in Median House Prices in Australian Metropolitan Cities: A Case Study of the West of Melbourne”.
